| Revision pack | All students are given a revision pack by their teacher every school holiday to use to revise. Use the revision pack to make flash cards and mind maps. |
| CGP revision guide | Read over topics that you are struggling with in your revision guide and answer the questions to consolidate your knowledge. |
| Sparx science | All students have a log in to Sparx science. It is the same as the maths log in, usually your full name (first and surname) in lower case with no spaces. Use Sparx for knowledge recall practise. Sparx Science - Home |
| Kerboodle | We have purchased a Kerboodle log in for every student. You can access the textbooks to read over all that you have learnt and answer questions to consolidate your knowledge. Your username and password is the first letter of your name and your surname, so if your name is Bob Smith your username is bsmith. The institution code is zho3. Kerboodle - Sign In |

| Black Revision Folders | Use these as your <i>core revision resource</i> . Work through each module section-by-section, completing the activities and highlighting key terms. Make Cornell notes then flash cards. Re-read the notes regularly and use the practice questions to test your understanding before attempting past papers. |
| Edexcel Revision Guide | Use for <i>condensed explanations</i> of all topics. Read a double page spread each night, highlight key teachings and quotes, make cornell notes and then self-quiz. Useful for quick recap before exams and for making flashcards. |
| Topic Guides for each unit | Use these to structure revision one topic at a time. Check off the content you understand and focus revision on any amber/red areas. Build short notes and flashcards directly from these guides. |
| Revision Videos (Teams) | Watch videos (Ben Wardle = long lesson length videos, Mr McMillian = shorter 10 mins recaps. GCSEPODs = 3-5 mins short run downs) when revising a tricky topic or when you prefer visual learning. Pause and take notes. Use as a quick refresher before the exams to strengthen recall of key beliefs, practices, and exam technique. |
| Savemyexams | Use for simplified notes, and exam-style questions. Read their topic summaries, then answer the practice questions to test knowledge. Good for checking understanding independently. |
| Past Papers, Mark Schemes and Examiners' Reports (Teams) | The best way to prepare for the real exam. Start by completing one question at a time, then attempt full papers. Use mark schemes to correct your answers and examiners' reports to understand what gains marks and what loses marks. Bring any past questions to Ms Hampson-Smith for homework to get targeted feedback |
| Seneca | High-impact tool for quick recall practice. Use for daily revision bursts (10-15 mins). Questions adapt to your level and strengthen memory of key terms, quotes, beliefs and exam structures. Great for beginning a topic or revising on the go. |

Your teacher has set you a range of homework tasks including vocabulary practice, grammar practice and example exam questions.</p> <p>Every time you complete a task, you will get immediate feedback on what you did well and what to focus on to improve further.</p> <p>If you need to practice specific areas and are not sure how, ask your teacher to set you other relevant tasks using this site.</p> <p>You can also access the GCSE textbooks here for free - these include audio files to help you practice for your listening exam.</p> <p>ActiveHub</p> |

| Past paper translations | <p>Practice the English --> Spanish translation questions from previous exams to help you improve your writing and translation skills. Use Google Translate to check your answers or bring your translation to show one of the Spanish teachers for detailed feedback.</p> <p>You can either access past papers yourself online OR pick up a booklet with 28 past paper translations to try from A172.</p> |
| Practice using Spanish in your daily life | <p>Find simple ways of including Spanish in your daily life to help you practice. Even if you don't understand everything, this is a great way to get more confident and build your vocabulary.</p> <p>Some ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Put your phone language in Spanish. • Set a rule with a friend in your class where you ONLY text or voice note each other in Spanish. • Keep a diary in Spanish where you write about your daily life. • Listen to easy Spanish podcasts such as News in Slow Spanish or the Duolingo Spanish podcast. • Put the audio of your favourite show in Spanish - you can keep the subtitles in English or put them in Spanish for extra challenge. • Find a new artist you like who sings in Spanish. • Read news stories in Spanish - a great source for this is BBC Mundo • Follow influencers who make content in Spanish. This could be someone who teaches Spanish on Tiktok, for example, or people who make content about other topics but only in Spanish. |

| Sticky Knowledge | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use the stickers to test yourself by answering the questions and checking if you can remember the key facts. • Learn the definitions on your sticker so you can explain the important words clearly in your own words. • Practise spelling the key vocabulary, because correct spelling helps you gain marks and use the terms confidently in exams. |
| Knowledge Organisers | <p>Knowledge organisers for all four of their examined units which have all the essential knowledge you need to know for the exam.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Self-quiz by covering a section and trying to recall the information, then check to see what you got right or need to revisit. |
| Flashcards - Command words | <p>Pick a flashcard and:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Say what the command word means. • Give an example question using that command word. • Explain how you would answer it using BUG or SEEL <p>Put them next to you when doing past papers or questions so you always:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Answer the question properly. • Use the right structure. • Avoid losing marks by misunderstanding the command word |
| Flashcards - Contraception | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Test yourself by looking at the method name and trying to remember how it works, how effective it is, and who can use it before you turn the card over. • Learn the definitions by reading the back of each card and making sure you understand what the key words mean (e.g., barrier, hormonal, permanent). • Practise spelling the commonly used words on the cards so you can use them correctly in exam answers (e.g., "contraception", "implant", "diaphragm"). • Sort the cards into groups – hormonal, barrier, long-acting, emergency – to help you understand the differences and compare methods. • Quiz with a partner by swapping cards and asking each other questions such as "What are the advantages?", "Are there any disadvantages?", or "How does it prevent pregnancy?" |

| | <p>Use the NHS Pregnancy website to check facts and understand key information you have learned in class. You can read clear explanations and definitions about antenatal care, birth options and preparing for labour. You can use it to test yourself by matching what you read on the website with your sticky knowledge and class notes.</p> |

Use the videos to fill gaps in your knowledge if you missed lessons or need concepts explained again. After each video write a short summary in your own words so you know you've understood it.</p> |
| Hodder Education My Revision Notes book | <p>Complete any outstanding guided revision homework in the book for Topic area 1-3.</p> <p>RAG-rate each Topic Area (Red, Amber, Green) in the exercise book you write in during lessons, so you know which topics need the most revision. Turn any Red or Amber areas into mini-revision targets, using flashcards, sticky knowledge, practice questions or short notes.</p> |
| Practice Papers with mark schemes and model 8-mark answers | <p>Remember to BUG the scenarios AND questions.</p> <p>For 6-8+ mark questions use different colour pens in your answer to show where you use SEEL e.g. write in these colours -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State = Red • Explain = Blue • Evidence = Purple • Link = Black <p>Then, using a green pen, mark your paper using the mark scheme provided - paying attention to examiners comments. Add in anything you missed or got incorrect.</p> <p>Next, use the model answers booklet to see what full 8-mark responses looks like, including how much detail, explanation and subject vocabulary you need to use. Compare your work to the model so you can spot if you missed or didn't explain fully. Use the differences between your answer and the model to improve your next attempt – adding detail, examples, and clear SEEL structure to get closer to full marks.</p> |
| Common misconceptions worksheet | <p>Tasks are linked to each misconception so you can practise the correct knowledge, language and exam technique.</p> <p>These tasks will help you avoid the same errors other students have made in previous papers, and strengthen the areas where marks are most often lost.</p> |

| Past papers | Use past papers to practise answering real exam questions under timed conditions so you get used to the style and difficulty of the Enterprise & Marketing exam. Try to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete a full paper without stopping to build speed and confidence. • Use the mark scheme afterwards to check how marks are awarded and identify areas to improve. • Review your answers and rewrite any that were low-scoring using the correct structure (e.g., explain, analyse, evaluate). • Look for patterns in the questions – what comes up often in R067 (e.g., marketing mix, customer needs, pricing strategies)? |
| Revision Guide | Use the revision guide to review all key content for both the coursework and exam units. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read one section at a time and make short summary notes. • Highlight key definitions such as <i>USP, segmentation, product lifecycle, break-even, fixed/variable costs</i>. • Use the diagrams, worked examples, and case studies to strengthen understanding of topics like pricing, promotion, and customer needs. • Use end of chapter questions to check what you've learned before moving on. |
| Pocket Power Ups | Use these as quick boosts before lessons, homework, or exams. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read one card a day to refresh important concepts like pricing strategies, customer segmentation, or promotional methods. • Keep them in your bag or pocket so you can revise anywhere – on the bus, between lessons, or at home. • Focus on cards linked to topics you find more difficult (e.g., financial calculations or marketing mix decisions). |
| 8-mark questions | Use these exam-style extended questions to practise high-level skills. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Choose a question and plan your answer using PEEL, SEEL, or a structured comparison. • Check that you include both sides of the argument (advantages and disadvantages) and end with a justified recommendation. |

| Worksheets | <p>Use worksheets to practise applying your knowledge in small chunks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete short tasks on topics such as market research, branding, pricing, or promotional techniques. • Use worksheets to practise tricky concepts repeatedly (e.g., analysing customer needs or identifying a USP). • Re-do questions you got wrong to reinforce learning. • Keep worksheets in a folder so you can look back and track your progress. |
| Class Notes | <p>Use your class notes as a personalised revision guide made from what <i>you</i> focused on in lessons.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Re-read your notes after each topic to make sure you understand the key ideas. • Highlight definitions, examples, and diagrams that you want to remember. • Turn your notes into flashcards, mind maps, or revision summaries. • Compare your notes to the Knowledge Organiser and add anything you've missed. |
