# Conduct During Examinations



## Joint council for Qualifications

Our school and our students are bound by the JCQ rules and regulations.

If these **rules and regulations are not adhered to** this could result in:

- Loss of marks
- Disqualification
- Extreme cases, disqualification from sitting any further exams for a specified period (**of up to 2 years**).

# Exam regulations and conduct



Please note, students will **fail the exam if they have a mobile phone or electronic device on their person.**

- Even if they are not using it!
- Even if it's turned off!

They must check their pockets every time they line up for exam.

We have to report to the JCQ and students will be disqualified for **up to 2 years.**


## Banned items

- Mobile phone
- Headphones
- Wrist watches
- Written notes





## Behaviour

- Students must demonstrate the **upmost respect for the invigilators**.
- Students **must not talk, turn around or engage with any other candidate** once they have entered the examination hall.
- **If challenged** – do not argue, cooperate and follow instructions.
- Students causing any disruption in the exam will lead to disqualification.
- Students cannot leave the examination hall unless accompanied by an invigilator. 



## Punctuality

- **Students must be on time.** AM exams start at **9:00 am** and PM exams start at **1:00pm**.
- Any late arrivals must be logged and shared with the JCQ.
- If students are any more than 30 minutes late, they will be refused entry.

## Illness or bereavement

- **General illness isn't considered as extenuating circumstances.** Student must sit their exam otherwise they will receive **no marks for that paper**.
- Special considerations will only be applied if a student is hospitalised or there is an immediate family bereavement. Evidence must be provided.
- In this instance students may be awarded an average grade-based on other papers but there is no guarantee.





## Toilet requests

- Students are encouraged to go to the toilet before their exam.
- Students **cannot** go to the toilet in the **first hour** of an exam or **last 30 minutes** unless they have a toilet pass.
- Student must raise their hand and ask an invigilator to add them to the 'toilet request' wait list if they need the toilet.
- We can only take a limited number per exam, so we ask that students only make request if it is essential.





## School uniform

- Students must wear **full school uniform**.

## Seat numbers

- Seat numbers will be displayed on student timetables
- Seating plans will also be available in the dining room





## Key Message for our students:

You must always show **respect for the invigilators/teachers**.

**If challenged about behaviour** (even if it wasn't you), you must:

- Accept it
- Stay silent
- Explain at the END outside of the examination hall.

# Access Arrangements



**Access arrangements are based on the support students already receive and need during lessons, and their eligibility status.**

**25% extra time-** Students can use this as having some 'thinking' time or time to check their work. They might need it if reading, writing, or processing information takes them a bit longer.

**Reader** - A reader helps them understand the questions so they can focus on your answers. They may need this if they have difficulties with reading words and sentences.

**Laptop/word processor** – Students may need a laptop due to illegible handwriting, a hand/arm injury or even a physical disability.

**Scribe** - A scribe writes down a student's ideas so they can focus on thinking. The scribe will only write down **exactly** what they say. They will lose SPaG marks with this arrangement.

**Modified papers/ overlays** - Students may need modified papers if they have a visual difficulty or need bigger, clearer text. They may need a coloured overlay due to having issues with seeing black text against white paper.

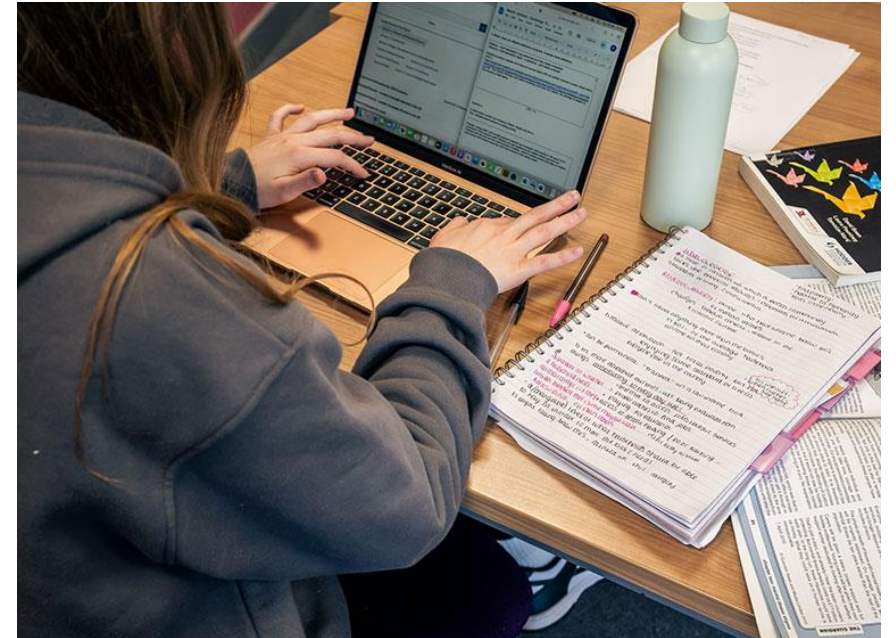

# Supporting your child's wellbeing



- **Create a routine:** help them to eat and sleep well during this period.
- **Encourage, don't pressure:** Praise effort, listen to worries, and avoid adding extra expectations.
- **Provide a good study environment:** Quiet space, working at a table or a desk with minimal distractions.
- **Promote balance:** Encourage short breaks, exercise, and time to relax alongside revision.
- **Look after wellbeing:** Watch for signs of burnout or anxiety and inform school if you are concerned.



# Supporting your child's attendance and punctuality



**Support your child in coming into school on time every day between now and the end of the exams.**

**Every lesson counts** - each lesson covers examinable knowledge and skills that can directly appear as marks on the paper.

**Every minute counts** – late arrival means missing explanations, exam tips, or model answers that can make the difference between grades.

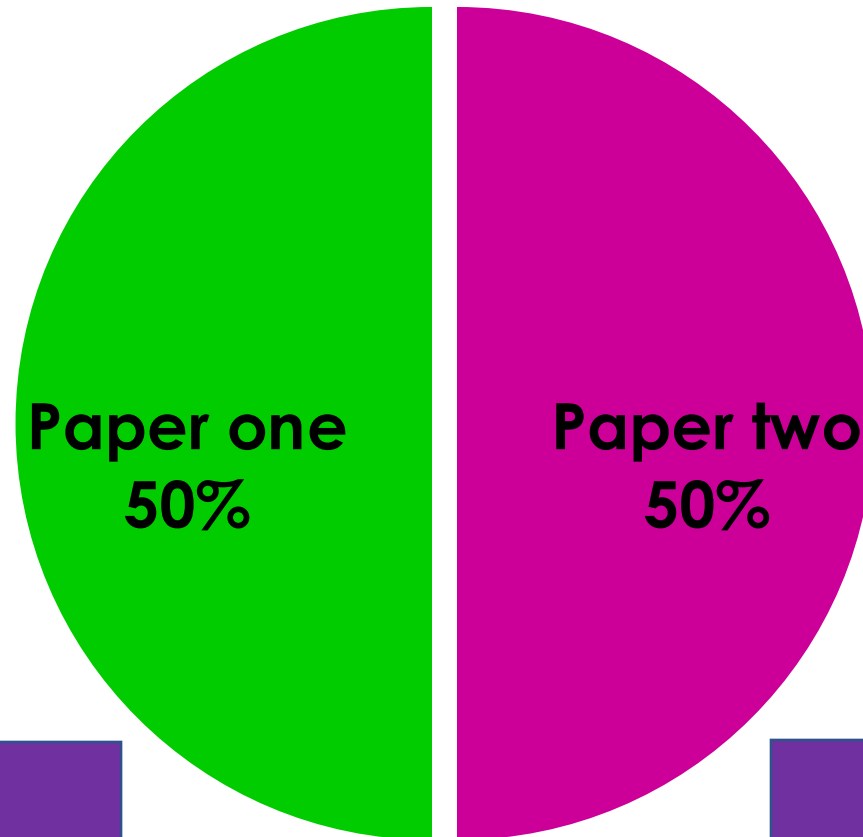

## Science

Resource	How it could be used
<b>Revision pack</b>	All students are given a revision pack by their teacher every school holiday to use to revise. Use the revision pack to make flash cards and mind maps.
<b>CGP revision guide</b>	Read over topics that you are struggling with in your revision guide and answer the questions to consolidate your knowledge.
<b>Sparx science</b>	All students have a log in to Sparx science. It is the same as the maths log in, usually your full name (first and surname) in lower case with no spaces.  Use Sparx for knowledge recall practise.  <a href="#">Sparx Science - Home</a>
<b>Kerboodle</b>	We have purchased a Kerboodle log in for every student. You can access the textbooks to read over all that you have learnt and answer questions to consolidate your knowledge.  Your username and password is the first letter of your name and your surname, so if your name is Bob Smith your username is bsmith. The institution code is zho3.  <a href="#">Kerboodle - Sign In</a>
<b>Planner</b>	Use the science pages in your planner to make flash cards and mind maps. You can also use the periodic table and physics equation sheet to support you with exam question practise.
<b>PMT</b>	The physics maths tutor website has past papers for combined science, biology, chemistry and physics separate science. Ensure you select the correct tier (higher or foundation).  <a href="#">Past Papers - PMT</a>
<b>Seneca</b>	Use Seneca for quiz questions to help you remember key facts that you have learnt.  <a href="#">Free Homework &amp; Revision for A Level, GCSE, KS3 &amp; KS2</a>
<b>Malmesbury education</b>	This Youtube channel has all the GCSE required practicals. You can watch a teacher carry out the practical and talk through important information, such as the variables and how to present the data that is gathered.  <a href="#">malmesbury science - YouTube</a>





We use the **AQA exam board** for all science GCSEs

Students will do one of two pathways:

- Combined Science – 1 hr 15 minutes
- Triple Science – 1 hr 45 minutes

All students will do one paper in Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Data informed decisions have been made to determine whether students will sit the higher or foundation paper.

Physics formulas and Chemistry periodic table are all provided in the exam. Students do not need to memorise.

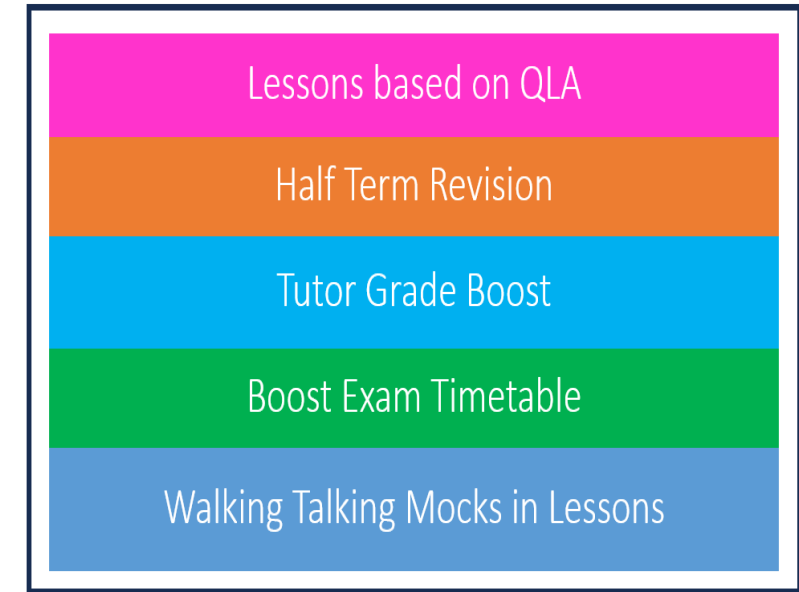
