In school - On time

Start of the day

Students who wish to succeed always attend and are on time. We are trusting that students will arrive at the Academy by 8.20am each day so that they are ready for the day's learning.

Lateness (everyday expectation 1)

Students are expected to be on time. Any lateness will be challenged, and consequences put in place if persistent.

Uniform

The Academy has strict guidelines on dress and all students are expected to wear the full Academy uniform. The wearing of our distinctive uniform gives students a sense of 'belonging', helps foster a pride in the Academy and stops students coming to the Academy in unsuitable clothes.



Uniform – How to size your child

 On the 'transition section of the website there is a useful video to support sizing of uniform items.

Uniform - General

Key point:

- Denim coats, hoodies, body-warmers and caps are not allowed.
- (Jeans and cords are not allowed, skirts to be no shorter than knee length)

The Year 7 uniform comprises:

- Plain white school shirt (not polo shirts)
- Academy tie
- Black trousers or skirt Academy V-necked jumper, in purple, with logo
- Black or grey socks with trousers, white socks, neutral or black tights with skirts.
- Some students may wish to wear a Salwar Kameez, in purple.
 This is acceptable, as long as the Kameez is at least knee length.



Uniform - Jewellery Key points:

- Jewellery is <u>not</u> allowed, except for one small, plain, metal ear stud in the bottom of the lobe of each ear
- One small plain ring may be worn.
- Nose studs or other facial jewellery are not allowed.
- Nail varnish or extensions are not allowed.



Uniform - footwear

Key points:

- No sports logos
- Boots or trainers are not to be worn.

- Shoes should be <u>black and sensible for</u>
 <u>school use</u>, flat soled or with very low heels,
 no more than half an inch at the front of the
 heel.
- They should have <u>no sports logos</u> or embellishments and should be able to take boot polish.
- High heeled shoes are quite unsuitable and are dangerous on our Academy sites.



Uniform - Hair

Key points:

- Excessive hair styles are strongly discouraged. We encourage all students with long hair to have it tied back.
- 'Cuts' into the hair of any shape or design are **not** allowed.
- Non-natural or multiple hair colours are not allowed.
- Plain black hats and scarves may be worn at the discretion of the Principal in very cold weather.



Uniform – Electrical items

- Key points:
- If parents/ carers need to contact their child they MUST call the school
- Electrical items, such as mobile phones and music devices are not allowed in the Academy and will be confiscated if seen or heard.
- If a student brings a mobile phone for safety reasons this must be switched off and at the <u>bottom of</u> <u>their school bag.</u>



Uniform - PE kit

- Black short-sleeved sports polo shirt with purple panels and Academy logo.
- Black long-sleeved reversible sports shirt with purple panels and Academy logo.
- Black track suit bottoms with grey stripe.
- Suitable trainers or other PE footwear.





Equipment - stationery

- Key point:
- We will have stationery on sale at reception each morning so that students can solve issues around lost equipment before lessons begin.
- Students who wish to succeed always bring the right equipment to the Academy, for the right lessons, each day.
- We wish to develop our students' <u>organisational skills</u> for success in future life.
- For any important role in life, we need the right equipment and students need to make sure they provide it.



Equipment – full table service

- Students are expected to bring the following to school:
- 2 black pens
- 2 green pens
- A clear pencil case
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- PE Kit (on the days they have PE)
- A sensible and suitable bag (not a fashion accessory)





First time, every time Key points:

- We know it is important that students learn self-discipline.
- We know that students who wish to succeed <u>do not answer back</u> and <u>trust</u> that teachers' instructions are to help them be successful.
- If an adult tells a student to do something, we expect it done straight away. We expect students to trust staff and never question an adult's decision anywhere in the Academy.



Rewards

Key point:

 We understand the value of rewarding students who master the knowledge, understanding and skills to be successful.

Rewards include:

- Achievement points and shop
- Golden tickets
- Star of the week
- Progress & effort certificates
- Acknowledgement events
- Annual reports
- Visits of the ice cream van
- ...and more!



Sanctions - general

There are a series of steps that we take to support our students change any behaviour that is not acceptable.

Verbal warning – We ask our students calmly to change their behaviour.

Yellow warning – Students who do not respond to the request will receive a instant 10 minutes detention to be served the same day.

Amber warning – Students who continue to disrupt learning will receive a 40 minute detention the same day (you will be notified if we have an up-to-date number)

Red warning – students who continue to disrupt are removed from the lesson so others can continue to learn without interruption. They receive a 60 minutes detention the following evening.

What is ClassCharts?

• Class Charts is an online tool which teachers use to track achievement and behaviour throughout the school day.

At Nottingham Academy, we believe in working closely with parents and carers and one of the key benefits of using Class Charts is that we are able to securely share your **child's achievement and behaviour report**with you and so keep you up to date in **real-time**.



ClassCharts – help online

 During the first week at school, your child will be given letter with a <u>login code for parents</u> to register on ClassCharts.

To support you with this, a video has been uploaded onto the website in the 'Transition' tab, to guide you through the process of registering.






Parent Pay

From September 2021:


