What are options?

The term 'options' is used to describe the subjects a student can choose to take at GCSE level.

- Students will select their options in Year 9
- They then complete during Year 10 and 11, leading to their GCSEs in the Summer Term of Year 11. These are also referred to as Level 2 Qualifications
- Students can then use these qualifications to undertake further education at Nottingham Academy 6th Form, colleges or move on to complete an apprenticeship at age 16. These are also referred to as Level 3 Qualifications





Core Subjects

All students will complete the following courses:

- English Language
- English Literature
- Mathematics
- Statistics
- Combine Science (worth two GCSEs)
- Core PE (not examined)

Vocational Qualifications

- Within Option B and C we offer a variety of BTEC, OCR Nations & WJEC qualifications
- These are subjects that apply learning to scenarios or tasks to gain knowledge of the subject area
- Vocational qualifications carry the same weight as GCSEs but offer a different approach
- They offer a more practical and theoretical approach than traditional subjects. There
 will be a combination of coursework and examined units across the two years
- Speak to your subject teachers to investigate how you can be successful in these courses

What if I miss the deadline to complete the form?

Mrs Lammin will arrange a 1-2-1 meeting to complete during the school day

What if I don't get my first choice?

We try our best to ensure that all students received their first choice, but if this subject is at capacity we will move to your second choice.

I do not know what subjects to pick?

Speak to Ms Smikle and Mrs Lammin or your subject teachers for support

How many GCSEs will I received at the end of Year 11?

1 GCSE per subject – triple science is worth 3 GCSESs and combined science worth 2

If I don't select triple science, I won't receive a science qualification.

Combined Science is a compulsory subject. All students will complete at least 2 GCSEs in science. Triple is designed for those that enjoy science and are considering completing at Post 16.
